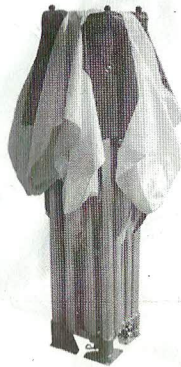


## Instant Shelters - Set Up Instructions

Please read the manual thoroughly and make sure you follow these instructions step by step to make sure you proceed in the easiest way possible. This is a two person manual, two is the ideal number of people for the job. Should there be only one person to erect the shelter or should it prove too difficult to erect according to this manual it might be necessary to either keep the canopy off the frame, until finished with step 6 or at least unscrew the bolts\* holding the canopy (\*Threaded balls supplied with 40 SERIES and 50 SERIES Shelters only) on the frame and roll the canopy up off the corners.

1. Open the frame half way out by pulling two opposite legs away from each other. Place canopy over the frame and align corners using threaded ball screws\* supplied - screw these through eyelets in corners of the canopy and into the top of each leg (\*Threaded balls supplied with 40 SERIES and 50 SERIES Shelters only).

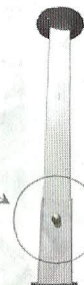
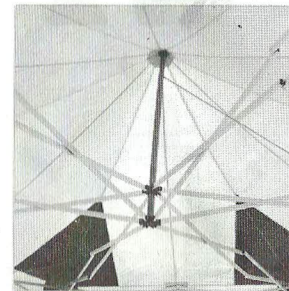
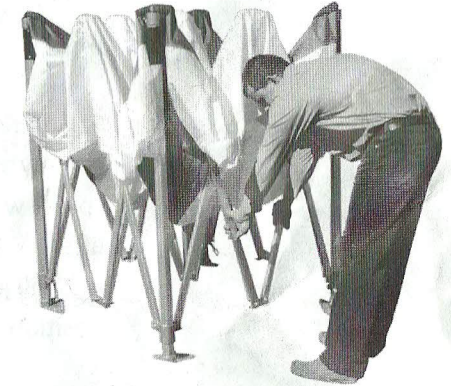


2. Place the shelter in the middle of the area where it is going to be erected and open it half way out by pulling two opposite legs away from each other.



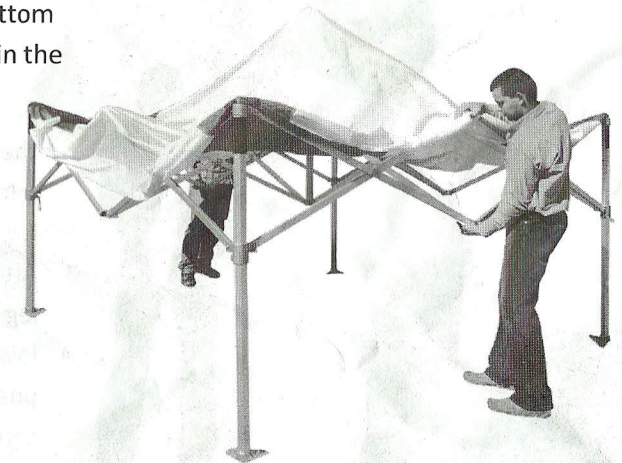
3. Roll the canopy over the corner joints to decrease the tension.

4. Grab the bottom of concertina sections on two opposite sides, lift slightly off the ground to prevent friction and walk away from each other. Open frame out approximately two thirds.



**Only** if you have a 3m\*3m\*3m Hexagonal Shelter, manually extend the central upright until it locks into position (Push button must be exposed). Do this from the inside of the shelter.

5. Take the upper and the bottom part of the side section right in the centre and squash towards each other.

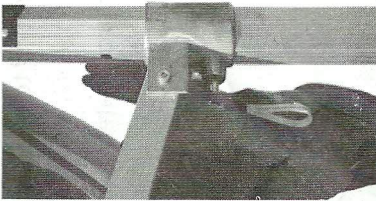




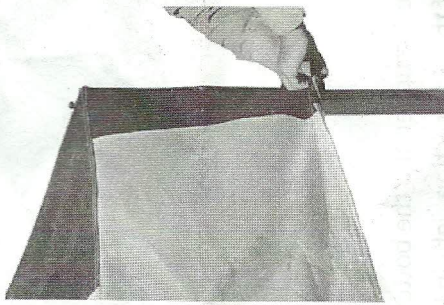
9. Repeat the step above on the remaining legs.



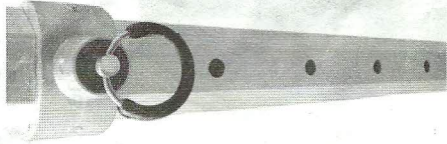
6. Get inside underneath the canopy and squish the central spider while the other person lifts the legs' sliding joints up until all joints are locked in position.



7. Roll the canopy back down on the corners.



10. Adjust the height setting to achieve desired total height.



11. **IMPORTANT:** It is absolutely crucial the shelter is properly anchored to prevent wind damage. Use supplied stakes and guy ropes!

12. **IMPORTANT:** If the shelter is transported lying down, the canopy must be removed whilst in transit.

8. Grab two corner legs on the same side, release the joints at the bottom of each leg and extend the legs. After the inner part of the leg slides out, lock in the lowest of the five height positions. The total height can be adjusted any time after.
